<u>Diary recount and the amazing discovery:</u> Recount the diary of Lawrence (fictional character) and discover more diary sections that will require further investigation. Lawrence's amazing discovery is revealed.

<u>Inside the 1878 Classroom:</u> Experience school life in 1916, meet the cranky Principal and learn classroom rules. Write in ink and help investigate the missing diary sections to uncover new discoveries!



<u>Jimmy's Kitchen:</u> Aboriginal artefacts, storytelling and old maps will lead us on a journey to find more amazing things. What is down the goanna track and in the slimy rock forest?
